William KNIGHT

William Knight was born at Clarence Plains, Hobart, Tasmania around 1885 to parents Lewis (Louis William) & Clara Knight (nee Smith).

William Knight was a 29 year old, single, Groom from Hobart, Tasmania when he enlisted at Warwick Farm, NSW on 13th September, 1915 with the 2nd Battalion, 15th Reinforcements of the Australian Imperial Force (A.I.F.). His service number was 12 & his religion was Church of England. His next of kin was listed as his father – Mr Lewis Knight of Hobart, Tasmania.

Private William Knight was in Camp training with "B" Company, 2nd Battalion from 14th September, 1915. He was transferred to "C" Company, Rifle Battalion on 21st February, 1916. Pte Knight was transferred on 3rd March, 1916 to Brigade Headquarters as Lance Corporal.

Lance Corporal William Knight embarked from Sydney on HMAT *Marathon (A74)* on 4th May, 1916 & disembarked at Devonport, England on 9th July, 1916.

Lance Corporal William Knight proceeded overseas to France with 9th Infantry Brigade on 21st November, 1916 from Southampton.

Lance Corporal William Knight was transferred to 35th Battalion & taken on strength on 10th September, 1917.

Lance Corporal William Knight was transferred to 9th Brigade Headquarters & taken on strength on 21st May, 1918.

Lance Corporal William Knight was on leave to UK from France from 31st January, 1919 to 14th February, 1919.

Lance Corporal William Knight was admitted to 2nd Scottish General Hospital, Edinburgh, Scotland on 12th February, 1919, whilst on leave from France & suffering from Influenza. He was reported as very ill & his condition later developed to double pneumonia.

Lance Corporal William Knight died on 1st March, 1919 at 2nd Scottish General Hospital, Edinburgh, Scotland from Pneumonia.

Lance Corporal W. Knight was buried on 7th March, 1919 in Comely Bank Cemetery, Edinburgh, Scotland – Plot number D. 47 and has a Commonwealth War Graves Commission headstone. From the burial report of Lance Corporal Knight - *Coffin was good. The deceased soldier was accorded a full Military funeral, and a large number were in attendance. The coffin was draped with the Union Jack, and conveyed to the graveside, surmounted by many beautiful wreaths sent from:- Australian Imperial Forces & New Zealand Forces; Nurses & Sisters from Hospital; Cpl. Holley of the New Zealand Forces; Victoria League; Mrs Cousins; Mrs Hamilton and three lady friends. The "Last Post" was sounded at the graveside, and Chap. Rev. Hannan of the 2nd Scottish General Hospital, Edinburgh, officiated. The grave will be turfed and an oak cross will be erected by the A.I.F. London. A.I.F. Headquarters London were represented at the funeral. Relatives & friends in attendance at the funeral – Brother – 378A Pte Knight, C.E. 4th M.G. Bn, and Cpl. Holley, New Zealand Forces and many Australian & New Zealand soldiers.*

Lance Corporal William Knight was entitled to British War Medal & the Victory Medal. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Lance Corporal Knight's eldest brother – Mr Joseph Frederick Knight of 29 Patrick Street, Hobart, Tasmania, as the closest next-of-kin. (Scroll sent April, 1923 & Plaque sent March, 1923). Mr Lewis Knight, father of William Knight had died on 12th June, 1918.

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission lists Lance Corporal W. Knight – service number 12, of H/Q. 9th Bde., Australian Infantry, A.I.F. No family details are listed.

Lance Corporal W. Knight is commemorated on the Roll of Honour, located in the Hall of Memory Commemorative Area at the Australian War Memorial, Canberra, Australia on Panel 2.

Lance Corporal William Knight is remembered on the Wall of Remembrance, at the War Memorial, Cecilia Street, St. Helens, Tasmania. The Wall of Remembrance commemorates those from Tasmania who died in service or were killed in action in World War One.

Front Inscription

Tasmania`s World War One Roll of Honour, 1914 - 1918

The names of 3165 soldiers, sailors and airmen who were Tasmanian by birth or residence and died from their service in WW1 are commemorated on these walls. Their names appear alphabetically, grouped by the year of death. These men served with Australian, New Zealand and British units.

"What these men did nothing can alter now. The good and the bad, the greatness and the smallness of their story will stand. Whatever of glory it contains nothing now can lessen. It rises, as it will always rise, above the mists of ages, a monument to great hearted men; and for their nation, a possession forever. "

Connected to Lance Corporal William Knight:

Younger Brother – Private Charles Edward Knight, 378A, 4th Machine Gun Company. Enlisted on 3rd July, 1916, aged 23 years & embarked from Melbourne on 19th September, 1916. Returned to Australia on 22nd August, 1919. He was entitled to British War Medal & the Victory Medal. Charles Edward Knight died in May, 1977 at Newtown, Tasmania.

Commonwealth War Graves Commission Headstones

The Defence Department, in 1920/21, contacted the next of kin of the deceased World War 1 soldiers to see if they wanted to include a personal inscription on the permanent headstone. Space was reserved for 66 letters only (with the space between any two words to be counted as an additional letter) & the rate per letter was around $3\frac{1}{2}$ d (subject to fluctuation).

The expense in connection for the erection of permanent headstones over the graves of fallen soldiers was borne by the Australian Government.

Lance Corporal W. Knight does not have a personal inscription on his headstone.

Comely Bank Cemetery, Edinburgh, Scotland

Comely Bank Cemetery, Edinburgh, Scotland contains 302 War Graves. There are only seven Australians buried in this cemetery from World War 1.

During the First World War, Edinburgh was headquarters to the 4th, 5th, 6th and 9th Battalions of the Royal Scots, with the 7th Battalion at Leith. The 2nd Scottish General Hospital (1,000 beds) occupied Craigleith Poorhouse, the Edinburgh War Hospital (2,600 beds) was in the Asylum buildings at Bangour and the Leith War Hospital (585 beds) in the infirmary at Leith. The port of Leith was used by hospital ships from north Russia and about 4,500 officers and men passed through it.

Second World War military hospitals were in Edinburgh Castle, Edinburgh Royal Infirmary and Bangour. The city was also Scottish Command Headquarters.

Edinburgh (Comely Bank) Cemetery contains 225 burials of the First World War, most of them forming a war graves plot in Section D. The Second World War plot is immediately in front and contains more than half of the 76 Second World War burials. The cemetery also contains a Finnish war grave and two non-war service burials.

An unusual feature of the War Graves plot is that the granite headstones lie flat. This was a decision made by the architect, Sir Robert Lorimer. The plot contains WW1 and WW2 casualties/Spanish Flu victims and a member of the Finnish Legion.
